School Swimming Scheme

Term 4 - Ready, Set School Enrolments

National Partnerships funding together with Good Beginnings will host The Ready, Set School program. The program is designed for parents and children beginning Kindergarten in 2012 and is **completely free**. The program will increase your child's readiness for Kindergarten and help engage parent/carers in understanding the education process.

The program will take place each Thursday and Friday morning from 9.15am - 11am and run for 8 weeks. It is very important that your child attends every session. Parents are asked to stay with their child for the first three weeks only. Sorry, no younger siblings may attend.

Each session will have a specific focus with a variety of activities including music, art, craft and social play. There will also be opportunities to visit the library, computer lab and become more familiar with different areas of the school. Many different skills will be highlighted including some simple, cheap and effective ideas for you and your children at home.
